*"I've heard that this intervention lawsuit is causing delays to our trust case and is going to hold up payout*** But I would still like some reassurance and more information about what's going on."*

*** thank you for your questions I will do my best to address them as succinctly as possible.

*** most of the interveners are of the age that we see the sunset to our time. Like you we would like to see this money in our lifetime. ***

I can't tell you anything about what is being paid to the attorneys handling this. *** seems to be a closely guarded secret. There is no reason that it needs to be a secret that I can fathom.

***Not knowing what we are paying the nations attorneys I can't say one way or the other if their compensation is fair. All I can do is wonder why it's such a huge secret.

*** I am Linda Heskett one of the seven litigants who brought this case. ***

First and foremost we want to make sure that all moneys derived from any possible settlement go to the headright owners. There is some concern that the new nation could take 10%, or there about, off the top of any settlement. We think there is no reason the nation should take that money, we the headright owners are the injured party. *** we have heard some rumors, unfounded or justified, that certain members of the tribe would like to take this money and split it up among all members of the new nation. *** The motion to intervene in no way seeks to delay the settlement of this case, quite the contrary. One of our main purposes for bringing this case is to see that it is moving along toward a conclusion. Any delays we may have caused are minuscule *** For example as quoted from our [the interveners] reply brief to the court, "Formal discovery has been extended and both existing parties [the nation and the United States government] have requested extensions of time or approved amendment of the case schedule numerous times. [See Dkt. 5, 15, 20, 53, 56, 59, 63, 73, 75, 80, 82, 158, 173, 189, 191, 192, 201, 202, 203, 215, 216, 245, 246, 250, 253, 277, 278 and 320]." *** Besides the fact that we are the clients, the nations attorneys seem only to communicate the status of this case with a very select few. We the litigators in the intervention don't believe this is right, after all it is our money.

*** the OSA has only gone as far as voting a resolution of support for this intervention. Meaning they approve of and agree with what we are doing. This doesn't mean that the OSA is the client in this lawsuit. The ***seven litigators are bearing the entire cost of the venture. The cost is steep and formidable but we believe this so important that we are willing to put our money behind it. *** We believe, what we stand to lose is to great to sit back and simply hope for the best. I will say it's one thing to fight a cause with someone else's money, as the nation has the privilege of

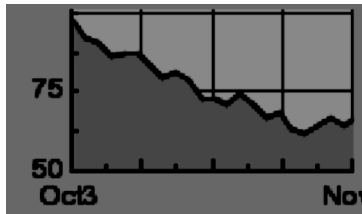

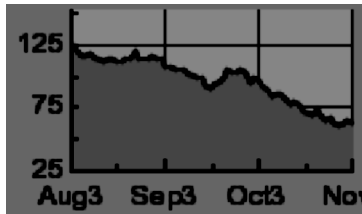

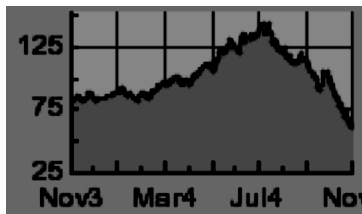

 \$63.91**



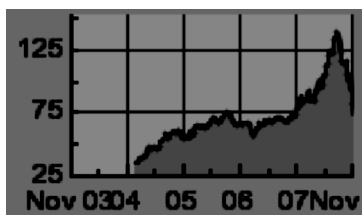
ONE MONTH

THIS TIME LAST YEAR...2007

Payment for the third quarter (September, 2007 Payment) WAS \$6,495.00 per headright. Payment was based on total revenue of \$14,481,832.00 for the second quarter production and collections. (\$14,481,832.00 ÷ 2,228.97393 headrights = \$6,497.08 rounded back to the nearest \$5.00).

The following were amounts broken out to show details of the \$14,481,832.00:

- Oil and Tank Bottoms production for the second quarter were: 1,113,967.45 gross barrels or 176,127.69 royalty barrels with oil revenue of \$11,270,650.30. **The average price per barrel of oil was \$63.99.**
- Gas production for the second quarter was: 3,418,829 gross M.C.F. or 598,668.26 royalty M.C.F. and 90,021 gallons. Total gas revenue for second quarter was \$3,433,248.69.
- Sand and Gravel royalty for second quarter was \$78,396.28.
- Oil and Gas Bonuses for second quarter was \$476,550.00.
- Interest earned for second quarter was \$128,313.00.
- Gross Production Tax to be paid to the State of Oklahoma for second quarter production was \$735,194.96.

THIS TIME THIS YEAR.....WOW!!!!

Payment for the third quarter (September, 2008 Payment) WAS a record of \$11,245.00 per headright!

Your payment was based on total revenue of \$25,070,911.00 for the second quarter production and collections. (\$25,070,911.00 divided by 2,228.97393 headrights equals \$11,245.00, rounded back to the nearest \$5.00).

The following were amounts broken out to show major details of the \$25,070,911.00.

Oil and Tank Bottoms production for the second quarter was 1,109,277.81 gross barrels
 Or 174,031.98 royalty barrels with oil revenue of \$21,475,868.00.

The average price per barrel of oil was \$123.40.

Gas production for the second quarter was: 3,124,485 gross M.C.F. or 547,134.09 royalty M.C.F. and 1,170,489 gallons. Total gas revenue for second quarter was \$4,375,105.09.

Sand and Gravel royalty for second quarter was \$63,592.33.

Oil & Gas Bonuses collected for second quarter was \$472,552.00.

Interest earned for second quarter was \$146,001.00.

Gross Production Tax to be paid to the State of Oklahoma for second quarter production is \$1,292,548.65.

Budget drawdown for C-395 operating expenses for second half of 2008 was \$200,000.00.

Miscellaneous revenue for second quarter was \$30,341.20.
